Grace, mercy, and peace are yours in Christ Crucified for you! Amen.

Dear Family of God at Grace,

As I write to you, we have just heard about the deaths of two saints of God, Darlene Hanley, and Rae Anne Ouillette. A third dear saint, Don Thomas, is close to being with the Lord

in his heavenly rest as well. These dear saints of God have fallen asleep in Jesus. They have walked through the valley of the shadow of death with their Good Shepherd and He has delivered them home! Death is never easy. It is the enemy: sin, death, and the devil--the big three. We are sinners; therefore, we die. The devil uses sin and death to drive a wedge between us and God. The devil is good at what he does. He is the great deceiver.

This Lenten season we have seen how the devil tempted Jesus in the wilderness; how he tried to prevent Jesus from winning victory for us over sin, death, and the devil. The devil could not beat Jesus...so now he turns his attention to us. The devil, the great deceiver,

tries to sow discord and division. He does this in our church, in each of our families, and in our own hearts. St. Peter is clear, "Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour" (1 Peter 5:8 ESV). Thankfully, Jesus has pulled all the lion's teeth and claws, so he can only gum you and bat you

around and roar mightily, but Jesus has won the victory over him, for you and me!

Our Lenten journey with Jesus to the cross and empty tomb is for our strengthening. God's Word is proclaimed so that we may have strength to meet the devil in battle and have victory in the fight. In our baptism God has made us His very own. He has washed us in the blood of Jesus. All that Christ won for us, is given to us in our baptism. We put on Christ; He is in us so together, with Christ we can stand firm against sin, death, and devil. In Christ, in the faith that He has given us, and in the sacrifice of Christ for us, we are victorious.

Lent is about Baptism. What I mean is that Lent and baptism go together. In the Early Church, the 40 days of Lent were a time of intense catechesis on baptism. The catechumen/neophyte, (we would call them confirmands), would spend those 40 days of Lent, thinking about and meditating on their upcoming baptism. Sermons and devotions during the Lenten season would focus on baptismal themes. Then at the Easter Vigil, the night before Easter Sunday, the catechumen would be baptized. They would then receive the Lord's Supper for the first time on Easter. Take time this Lententide to remember the great gift you received in your baptism!

Let me give you updates about the school and future staffing at Grace. We had a great visit with Patrick and Alexa Steckbeck and their precious little son, Ryker. Things continue to move positively in the direction of hiring Patrick and bringing him here for the Classical Homeschool Hybrid that we hope to start in the Fall. At the Voters' Meeting coming up in March, we will discuss and vote to move forward with the school. Keep an eye on the bulletin about the budget for Gratia Classical Academy.

The Elders voted to move forward with filling out a Vicarage Application. What does this mean? It means that we could get a Vicar (Student Pastor) for a year. The Vicarage would start in July and end in June. A Vicar would be a stopgap as we spend time talking to all of you about the direction you want Grace to go in. Whomever we bring in will need to step into some beloved and big shoes that Kami Jo is leaving. Having someone for a year that comes and goes, like a vicar or intern is a great way to begin to set up the next full-time Called staff member for success. This gives Grace some time to rejoice and to mourn our loss and the changes that are happening.

It is the Church Council's desire to have two informational meetings on Thursday, March 21st at 11:30am and at 6:30pm. It will be the same meeting both times. These meetings are open to the entire congregation. Come and share your thoughts on what direction

you would like to see Grace go: DCE, DCM, Family Life Ministry, Pastor or...you tell us. At these meetings we will spend some time explaining what the alphabet soup of DCE, DCM, Family Life Ministry, DCO, Deaconess, Pastor is all about and then we want to hear from you! We will do these meetings more than just this once.

Lastly, we want to thank Pastor Just and Linda for a wonderful time together. We have been blessed to have them. Pastor Just will be returning to the seminary to teach classes in the Spring quarter, which will begin March 11th. Pastor will return to be with us for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday. He will also return at the end of April for a weekend when I'll be gone for my brother-in-law's Fiftieth birthday. We look forward to them returning next season. Thank you again for your wonderful service to Grace!



Missionary of the Month - Pamela Boehle-Silva

Pamela graduated with a master's degree in Deaconess Studies from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, in 2011. She serves as a deaconess at Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Rocklin, California, providing mercy care to those suffering in body and soul. She received a Bachelor of Sciences Degree in Nursing from California State University, Sacramento, in 1983. As a Registered Nurse, she has wide-ranging nursing experience: neonatal intensive care,

pediatric oncology, pediatric ICU, public health, home health, and hospice nursing. In 1996, she completed the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod's Parish Nurse Distance Learning Program and became a parish nurse for Holy Cross. Since 2006, Pamela has traveled to Kenya, Sudan, South Africa, Madagascar, Tanzania, and India, working alongside deaconesses and pastors to promote Christ's mercy of body and soul. As of 2022, she has been to Kenya twelve times and continues her mercy work there. Pamela is one of the founding directors of both Always Mercy and Rehema Open Door.

Always Mercy is a nonprofit organization dedicated to helping the poor and needy of Kenya.

The roots of Always Mercy were planted in 2006 when Pamela Boehle-Silva, RN, from Rocklin, California, was invited by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya (ELCK) to educate church workers, specifically deaconesses, on HIV-AIDS awareness, treatment, and prevention. Tragically, many with this diagnosis or even a hint of that horrible "skinny disease" were shunned by their families, their village, and even their church. In Kenya, shame and stigma are very real experiences for those who are visibly ill. Even from her first visit in 2006 and subsequent visits, it became evident to Pamela that the need for care extended far beyond HIV-AIDS. Many Kenyans suffer needlessly from pain, chronic but treatable illnesses, or untreatable, terminal illnesses. To learn more about this charity, visit www.alwaysmercy.org
